

Richard A. Barkow AF A member of the Michigan City Power Squadron for 23 years.

Dick was born June 16, 1944, in Michigan City to Norman Charles and Gwendolyn Marie (Ballard) Barkow, who both preceded him in death. On June 29, 1968, he married Carroll Elizabeth Cullom, who survives in Michigan City. Also surviving is his daughter Elizabeth Marie (Vernon) Towle, LaPorte; grandchildren Sean Allen and Ryan Randall Towle; brothers William (Denise) Barkow, Chesterton, Lawrence (Cheryl) Barkow of Farmington, Maine, and Kenneth (Paulette) Barkow of Michigan City; sister-in-law Susan Hall; nephews Christopher, Stefan, Kevin, Keith, Larry Joe, and Daniel; nieces Alison and Kimberly; as well as many cousins. After graduating from Elston High School in 1962, he joined the U.S. Navy and spent 4 years as a communications technician stationed at Pensacola, Florida, Adak, Alaska, and Hawaii; he was awarded the Joint Service Commendation Medal. In 1966 Dick was employed at Bethlehem Steel (now Arcelor-Mittal Steel); and for most of 45 years has worked as a control computer operator, right up to three days before his death. Even though he loved his work, and giving his fellow comrades at the mill a hard time, he also enjoyed skiing and sailing. As a member of Duneland Ski Club, he enjoyed many hours on mountain slopes with friends. 
